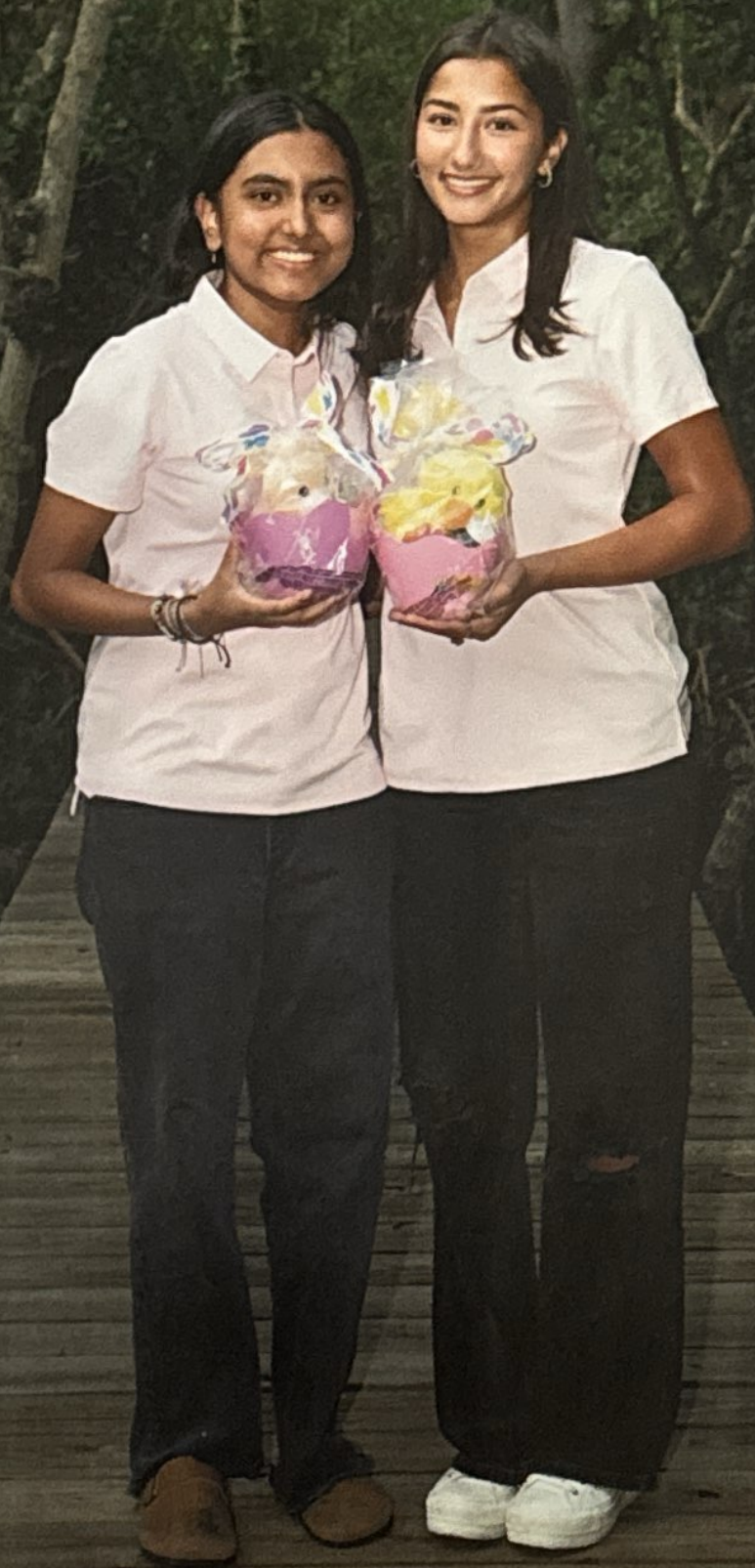

It's the small acts of kindness that can make a difference to those who need help and healing. Resident Suma Gadde likes making a difference through Create for Kids, which helps children in hospitals.

"We donate cards, art supplies, and books to read to children in hospitals," explains Suma. We also volunteer our time with them to show them support during a rough time. I wanted to start it because it's a good way to give back to my community and help people." When her childhood friend was diagnosed with cancer, Suma knew she wanted to make a difference for others. Starting a nonprofit was the answer.

FOUNDED IN 2023, CREATE FOR KIDS has a simple mission. Suma explains, "We believe that art is a vital component of the healing process, and we strive to create a nurturing environment that promotes creativity and smiles. Our volunteers are passionate about their work and are dedicated to making a lasting impact on children's lives."

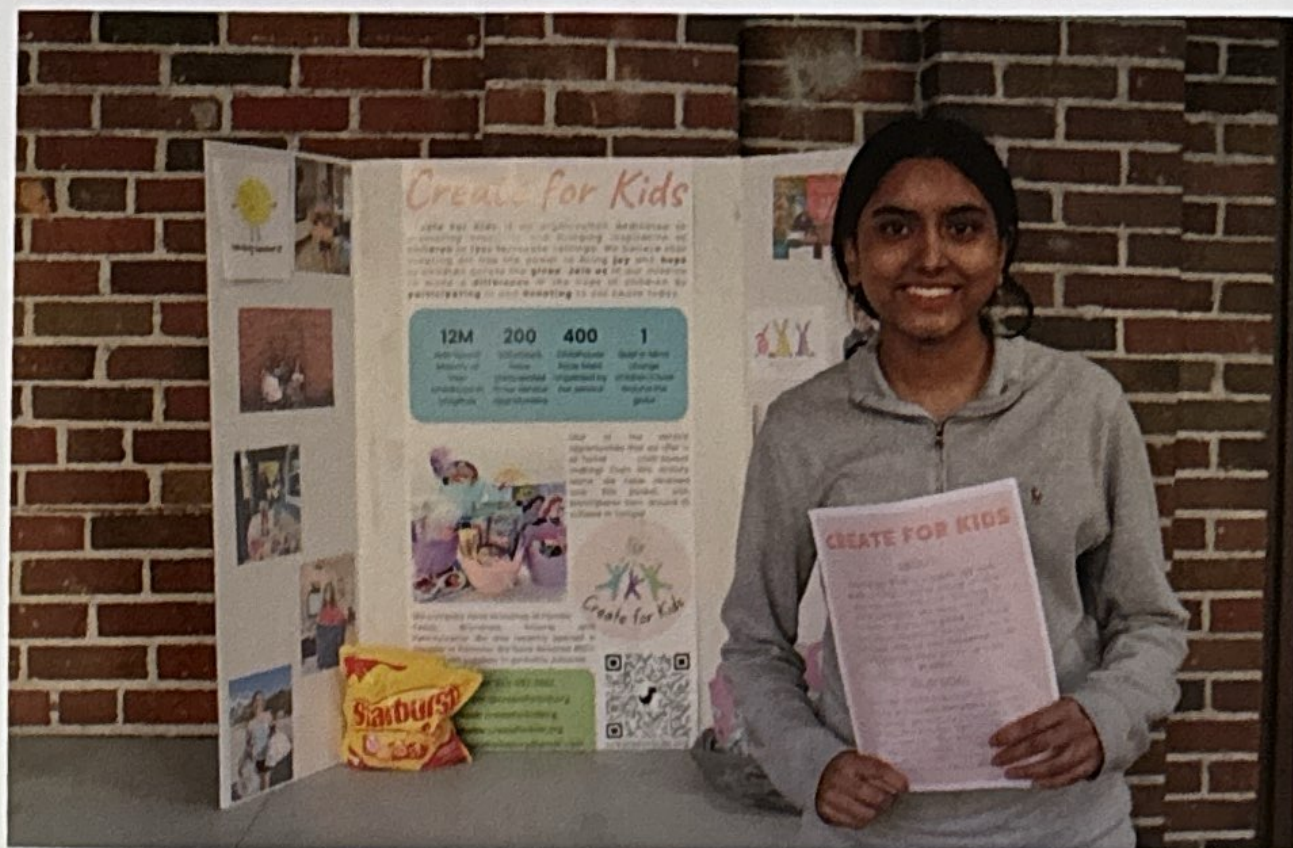


The nonprofit started in Florida but has since expanded to Pennsylvania, Texas, New York, North Carolina, Hawaii, Arizona, and Panama.

How did the organization grow? "We started posting a lot on social media," explains Suma. Her Vice President Sarah Younes does a lot of the Instagram posts. "I post daily reminders to show that there are things that we can do for kids," explains Sarah. She has posts of children unboxing the kits they are given and the impact that they make in their lives.
